

ADULT SOFTBALL LEAGUE RULES

Official playing rules are the Amateur Softball Association (A.S.A.) Rules of Softball, with the following noted or added exceptions:

1. Players must be 16 years of age or older.
2. The first team listed on the league schedule is the home team and provides a new game ball and a back-up ball. The home team will keep the official scorebook.
3. **ROSTERS** – New players can be added or transferred to another roster up to September 3rd. Players may be on only one roster in **EACH** division (men's, women's, & coed) for A.S.A. championship play.
4. **PICK-UP PLAYERS** – Teams are permitted to add or substitute a maximum of two players as follows:
Pick-up players must be on an A.S.A. roster by the September 3rd deadline. No exceptions for this rule will be made.
 - a. Players may only play up from the highest level they are currently participating at on a given night. For instance, no Men's OPEN or Coed Intermediate may play in any Recreation Division as a pick-up player.
 - b. The opposing teams must be made aware of and agree on pick-up players prior to the start of a game. Consent must be proven with a **Pick-up Player Consent Form**, which is to be signed by both team managers and the player(s).
 - c. **If the opposing team does not give consent to the proposed pick-up players, the game will be ruled a forfeit.**
 - d. Use of pick-up players without an opponent's consent is illegal, and grounds for forfeit. All such cases will be brought to the S.V.S.A. Advisory Board to decide.
5. The minimum number of players needed to start and finish a game is:
 - a. Men's = nine (9). Coed = eight (8) – teams may never have more males than females playing at the same time.
6. **Three (3) forfeits** in a season will automatically disqualify a team from further league participation without a refund.
7. **A TEN-RUN RULE** will be in effect in all league games after the trailing team has a chance to bat in the 5th inning.
8. **No player is to be smoking on the playing field or dugouts. Alcohol is NOT allowed in the Skagit Playfields Complex.**
9. Teams are allowed to bat their entire roster. However, if a player leaves the facility, is injured and unable to play, or ejected from a game, that spot in the batting order will be considered an out if there is no available substitute.
10. **HOME RUNS** for Men's Recreation Divisions will be one (1) progressive. A team can not be more than one over the fence Home Run ahead of the other team. All Other Divisions (Men's & COED) will be three (3) progressive. A team can not be more than three over the fence Home Runs ahead of the other team.
11. **COURTESY RUNNERS** will be defined as:
 - a. Any player injured during the game may have a courtesy runner. A player of the same gender who registered the last out that his/her team made will be the courtesy runner.
 - b. One courtesy runner may be named prior to the start of a game. The courtesy runner in this instance will also be the player of the same gender who registered the last out that his/her team made. If at the start of the game with no outs for a particular gender, the player of the same gender at the bottom of the batting order will be designated the courtesy runner.
12. **BASE STEALING (MEN'S SLOW PITCH ONLY)** – RUNNERS MAY ADVANCE WHEN THE BALL REACHES HOME PLATE, OR IF THE

PITCHER HAS THE BALL AND IS NOT IN THE VICINITY OF THE PITCHING PLATE.

13. **COMMITMENT LINE & SAFETY LINE** - COED Divisions ONLY. Once a player crosses the Commitment Line between 3rd Base & Home Plate they must continue through to Home. The act of crossing the Safety Line (Home Plate to backstop) will now act as Home Plate, whereas any player running Home that touches Home Plate will be considered out. Also, all plays at Home Plate will be force outs (i.e. once a player crosses the Commitment Line they can be forced out at Home).
*** Coed teams see information at bottom of rules with additional Commitment & Safety Line definitions.**
14. **Only A.S.A. approved bats** may be used. Check A.S.A. certified equipment at http://www.asasoftball.com/about/certified_equipment.asp.
15. **NO METAL CLEATS** are to be worn at the Skagit Playfields!!
16. **TIME LIMIT** – A one (1) hour and fifteen (15) minute time limit will be imposed on all league games. **No new inning will start after one (1) hour and ten (10) minutes, unless the game is tied. At this point the International Tiebreaker will be used (Each team comes to bat with a player on 2nd base that was the last player to make a plate appearance in the previous inning.). The final round of the evening will have a one (1) hour and thirty (30) minute time limit!**
17. **RAIN OUT INFOLINE** – Call 360-419-3390 or check www.skagitcounty.net on the Internet.

No warm-ups are to occur on any of the paved walkways through the Playfields or near the concession stand. Avoid throwing towards areas that people are congregating in.

Misconduct will not be tolerated. Managers and coaches are responsible for their team and fans behavior.

*SCPR Commitment & Safety Line Rule

The Safety Line shall be marked between home plate and the fence on the third base side of the diamond, perpendicular to the third base line. **On a play at home plate, a runner will be called out if he or she touches or crosses the Safety Line after the catcher has the ball and is in contact with the plate (i.e. a force play).** Otherwise, the runner will be safe. A runner will be considered to have crossed the Safety Line once they touch the ground on or beyond the line.

The catcher may still tag runners out if **NOT** standing on Home Plate. **If the runner touches home plate, runs over the plate or on the infield side (fair territory) of it, or makes intentional contact with the catcher, the runner will be called out.**
EXCEPTION: The runner will not be out for any of these reasons if the catcher, or any member of the fielding team, is blocking the scoring/Safety Line so that the runner cannot be reasonably expected to cross it properly. **NOTE:** The runner is permitted to slide across the line.

A "Commitment Line" will be drawn perpendicular to the third base line, one half the distance down the line from third base toward home plate. Once a runner has touched or crossed the "Commitment Line", he or she has committed to trying to score and may not return to third base. A force play will now be in effect at home plate and the conditions of the previous rule will apply. **In the event that the runner returns to third base and does not try to score after having "committed", the runner will be called out once the play is over IF APPEALED TO THE UMPIRE. EXCEPTION: A runner who "committed", passed the commitment line, may return to third base after a caught fly ball OR to touch a base previously missed.**

DEAD BALLS: When a **HOME RUN** is hit (the ball clears the outfield fence), a **BASES LOADED WALK** or an **OVERTHROW** that goes **OUT OF PLAY** occur, the runner(s) **WILL NOT BE OUT** if they touch home plate.
